at the Delta Winnipeg. The theme chosen by the Convention Planning Committee for 2025 is "Connection, Collaboration, Celebration."

The Committee is thrilled to announce that Cassie Campbell-Pascall will join us as a keynote speaker at our upcoming convention! Cassie is a twotime Olympic gold medalist in women's hockey and an eight-time world champion. Additionally, she made history as the first woman to provide



colour commentary on Hockey Night in Canada. We eagerly anticipate Cassie sharing her experiences on the board of Hockey Canada, her personal journey, and her insights on board governance and leadership.

The remainder of the program is still being finalized, but the broad outline of the programming is set. Day 1 (Thursday) will focus on professional development followed by the President's Banquet. Resolutions will be debated on Day 2. Association business, including elections for positions on the Provincial Executive, will also be conducted on Day 2.
